



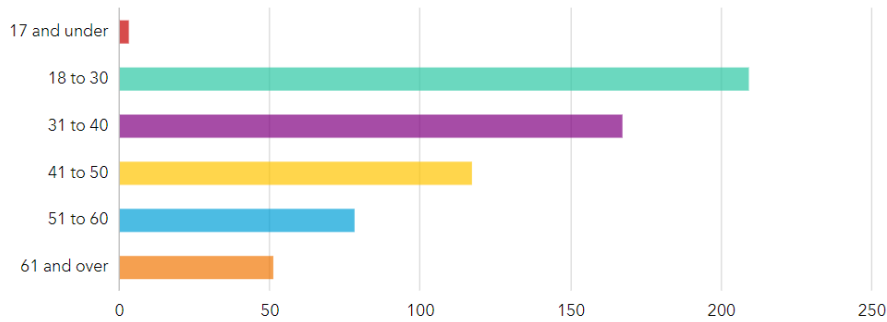

Age group

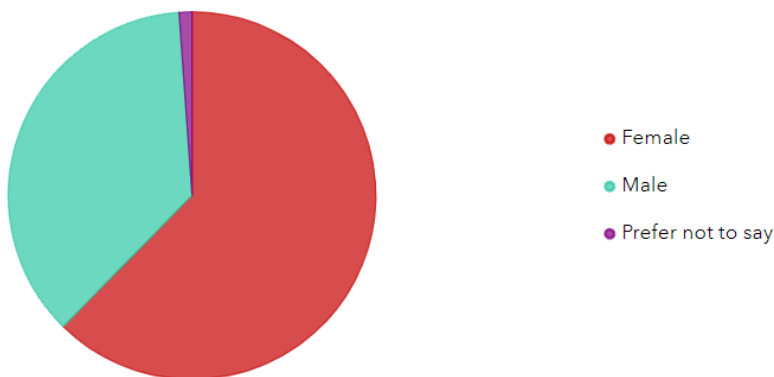


33% were between **18 to 30 years old.**

27% were between **31 and 40 years old.**

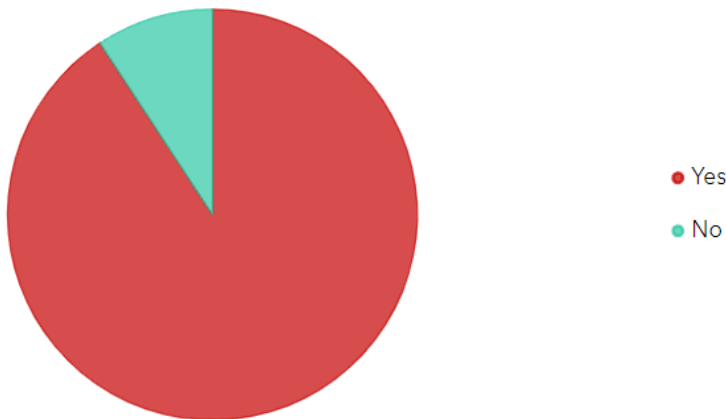
18% were between **41 and 50 years old.**

Sex



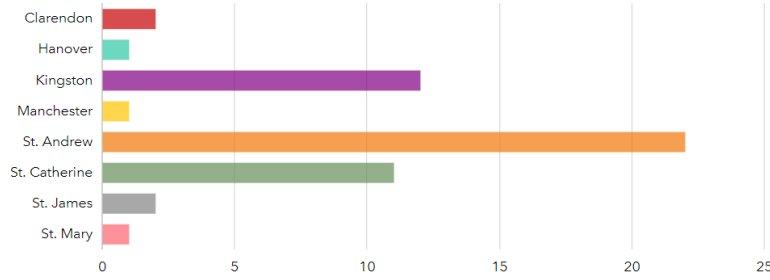
61% of the respondents were **female**, while **36%** were **male**.

Other Residents

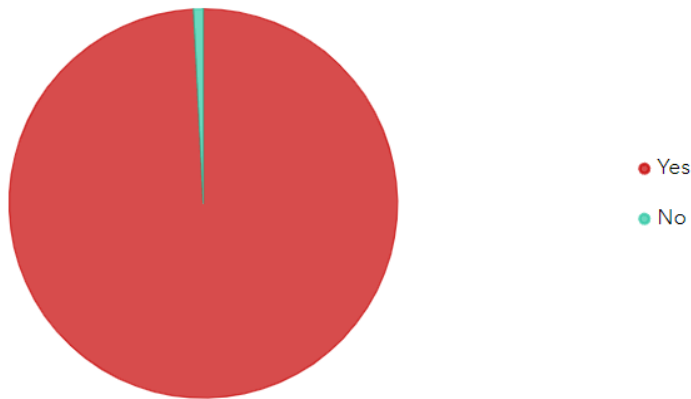


Of the respondents outside of Portmore:

- **21%** from **other areas in St. Catherine**.

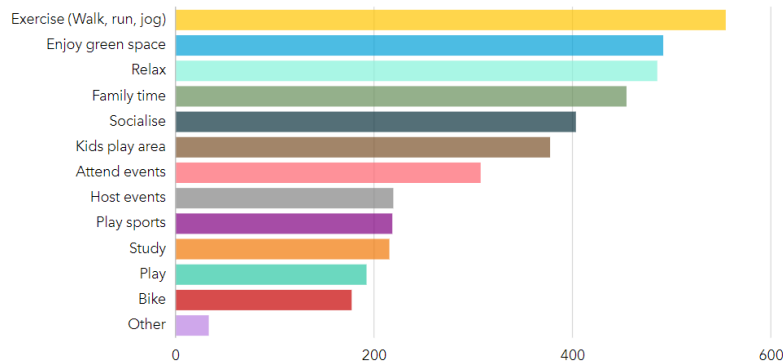
Park Design

78% - Enjoy green space

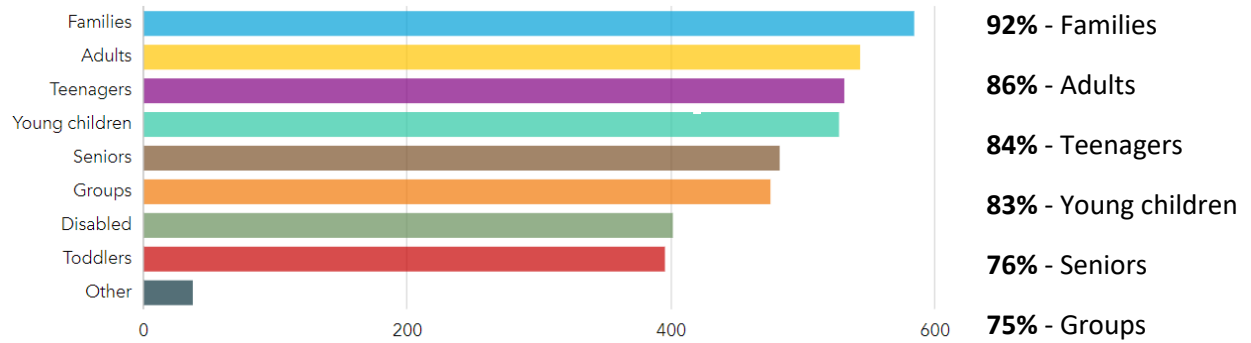

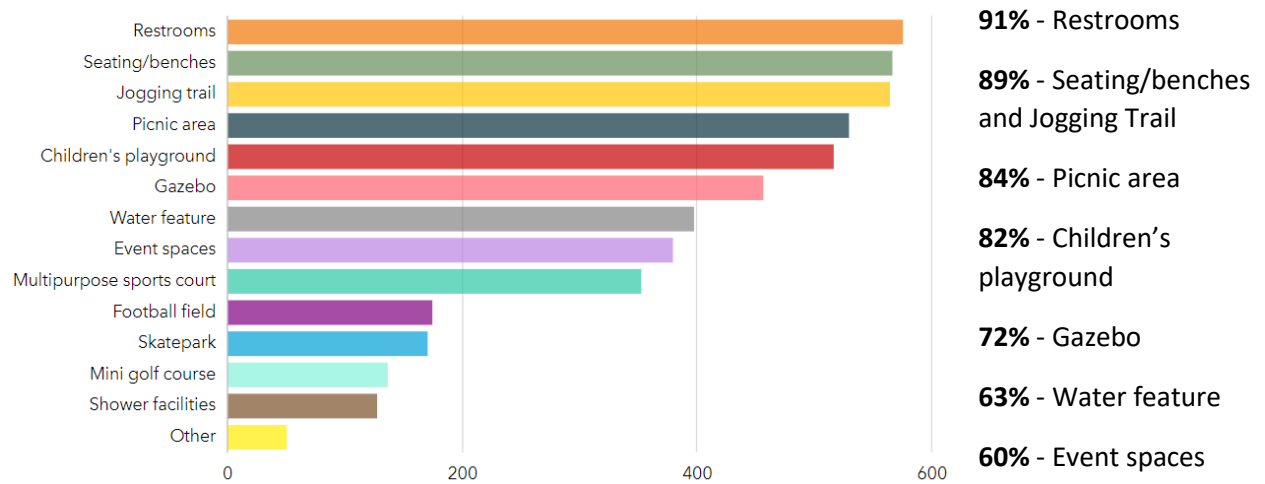

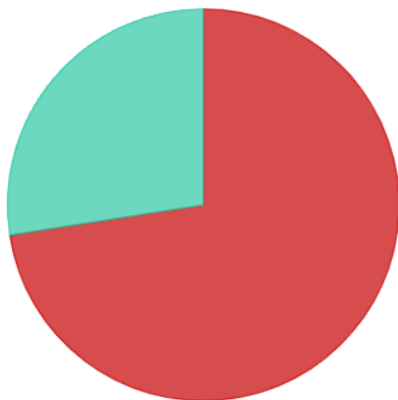

Pay for maintained facilities



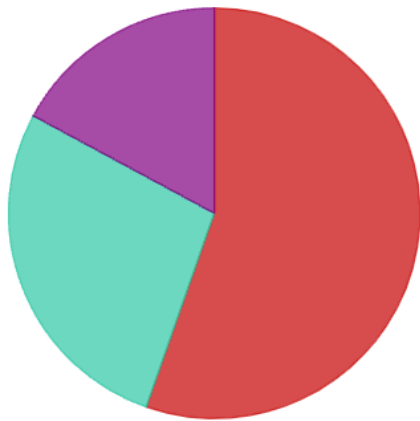

Of that number:

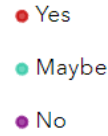
- **46% are willing to pay \$200**

Park Membership Club

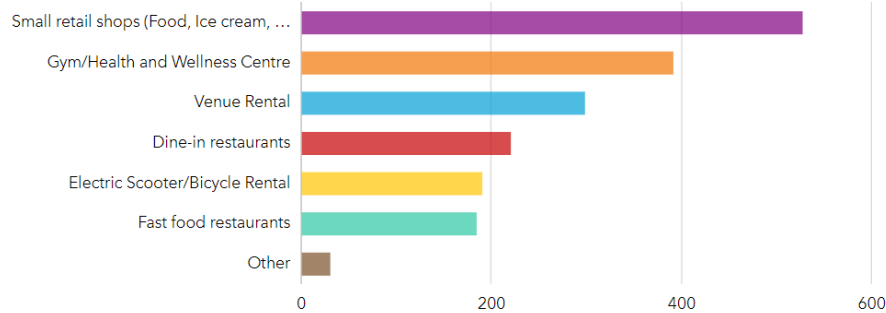


55% of respondents are interested in joining a **park membership club**.

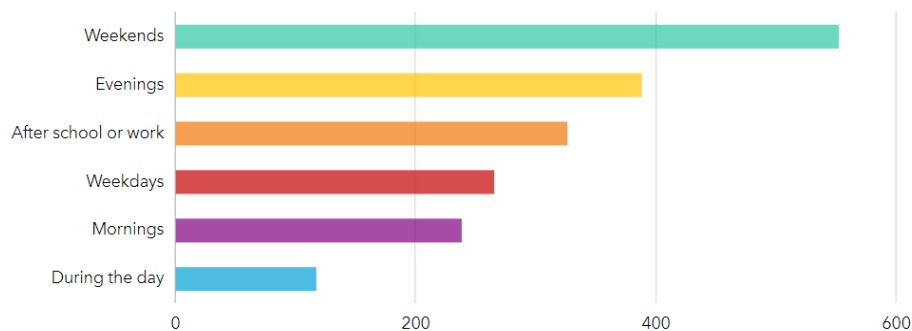

Park Usage Times



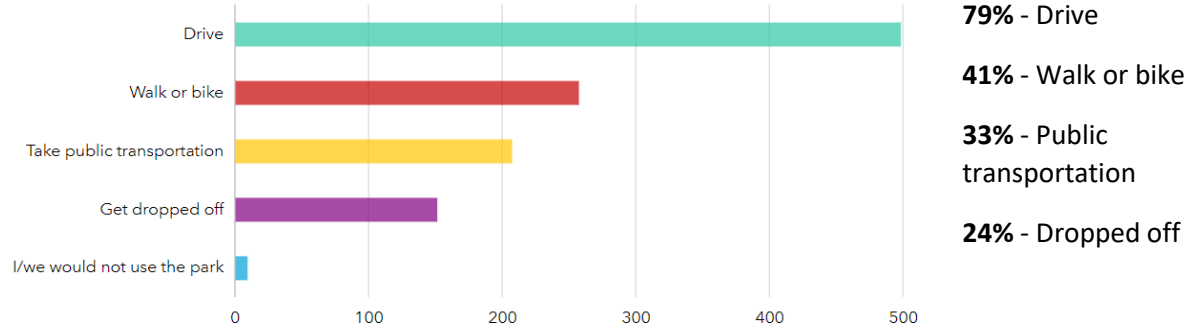
